# YEAR IN REVIEW



This spring, the **PANHELLENIC COUNCIL** hosted seven 'Service, Sisterhood, and Socials' events following of each PHC Grand Body Meetings to foster stronger bonds and unity within the Panhellenic community.

- 1 The **NATIONAL PAN-HELLENIC COUNCIL (NPHC)** hosted it's annual Step-Show in April with over 240 people in attendance and raising over \$2,000 to go towards the fundraising campaign of their campus NPHC Plots.

The **NATIONAL PAN-HELLENIC COUNCIL**, **INTERFRATERNITY COUNCIL** and **PANHELLENIC COUNCIL** sent council leaders to the annual Association of Fraternal Leadership & Values (AFLV) Conference in Indianapolis, IN this past January.

- 2 The **NATIONAL PAN-HELLENIC COUNCIL (NPHC)** welcomed back Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Inc. in Fall 2024 and Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. in Spring 2025. With their return, NPHC now has a full yard for the first time in recent memory.

In March, **INTERFRATERNITY COUNCIL** and **PANHELLENIC COUNCIL** launched a 2-week study competition where fraternities and sororities logged study hours. Weekly chapter and individual winners were recognized. 11 chapters participated.

- 3 In April, **INTERFRATERNITY COUNCIL** and **PANHELLENIC COUNCIL** hosted various events to support sexual assault awareness month, including a drop-in service event where the community came together to create over 100 self-care kits for Hope and Healing and put luminaries outside of their homes to show messages of support for survivors.

# GREEK LIFE GRAMMYS

The Office of Fraternity and Sorority Life partnered with the IFC, NPHC, and PHC governing councils to put on Greek Week, Nightmare on Spicer Street from October 14-18. The 19 participating chapters were broken into five teams to compete in events throughout the week including capture the flag, service day at the Akron-Canton Regional Food Bank, bobbing for apples, tug of war, and the annual Greek God and Goddess pageant. 343 students participated in the week's events. The 2024 Greek Week champions were Team 4: Michael Meyers, made up of Delta Gamma, FIJI and Omega Psi Phi.

The Office of Fraternity and Sorority Life hosted the first-ever Greek Life Grammys on Sunday, April 13, 2025. This reimaged version of Songfest featured music video submissions judged by special guests, with additional points earned through pop-up events like Raising Cane's Dine-to-Donate and Penny Wars. Over \$1,000 was raised for philanthropy, with proceeds going to the winning chapters. The 2025 Greek Life Grammy winners were Alpha Delta Pi and FIJI.

## FALL 2024

Fraternity and Sorority Life hosted President Nemer for Collegiate Issues on Monday, October 28<sup>th</sup>. Dr. Nemer's keynote centered on the concept of buy-in within an organization, emphasizing the critical role Fraternity and Sorority Life organizations play in creating a sense of belonging among students. The event drew an impressive 337 students, whose engagement was heightened by a dynamic Q&A session that followed the keynote. During the Q&A, Dr. Nemer addressed questions from the FSL community, offering personalized insights and actionable advice that resonated deeply with attendees.

## SPRING 2025

On Monday, March 3rd, the Office of Fraternity and Sorority Life hosted an incredible Greek Alumni Panel, bringing together a fantastic group of alumni who shared their experiences and insights with our community! Thanks to a collaboration with the Alumni Association, this event was a huge success, with over 60% of the Fraternity and Sorority Life community in attendance.
